Our Lesson Study This Morning

This morning we are studying the subject of Jesus in the Writings of Peter

Please read 1 Peter 2:22-24

Three times the words “sin” or “sins” are used in these verses. When we think of the meaning of these words they are usually associated with behaviour; actions of wrong doing.

However, if you were to discover that the Greek Lexicon has them listed as words that are translated from Greek nouns, how would that affect your understanding of these verses?

It reminds me of my old school days when we had to learn that in basic elementary grammar a verb was a doing word and a noun was a name. This is true in any language.

So, does this change your understanding of these verses to what you thought they meant in the past?

We will be discussing this in the lesson study this morning. If you are reading this from your e-mail copy received in advance then maybe you could give this some thought and come prepared.
